


Fashion Show

Carnival Day! To add to Wagar's many returns, carnival day enjoyed new life. Many students participated in skating and skiing.











A very rare event has occured. Wagar hosted a benefit concert for wildlife. The bands performing were Slaves on Dope, Shades of Culture and Reverence.








Open House was once again a success. The band was on hand along with Mr. Murison's infamous science/magic show. It was a hair raising experience.







