Dear Graduate,


To the graduates of 1970 I extend my warmest congratulations. You have successfully completed your schooling and are standing on the threshold of a new era and a new decade.

VALEDICTORY

Today our society's institutions are undergoing massive reappraisal on the part of the young people who are inheriting them. The post-war generation has been influenced by forces and tensions that did not influence the preceding generation. The variance in outlook between the two groups can be attributed directly to their different experiences. Today's students and young adults are developing new attitudes towards many of the pillars of the existing social order. The institution of education is our vital concern; it is now the object of a most vigorous evaluation. Similarly, old values and customary rituals are no longer accepted or practised without question.

Let us examine various attitudes of the graduating students toward this ceremony. There are those who consider it a meaningless formality, those who will remember it fondly as a sentimental occasion, and those whose feelings approach indifference, who don't care very much one way or the other. Whatever else, these graduation exercises do provide a chance to see old acquaintances and teachers. A natural by-product is retrospection - a reflection upon the past four years at Wagar.

These years are considered from a distant vantage point, for now I belong in a new situation and new surroundings. The months of absence have not afforded a clearer perspective - in fact, my classes, my courses, my teachers seem to blend into one fuzzy image. I cannot attach either label: all-good or all-bad. I do not wish to praise lavishly or denounce violently. School was an important setting for socialization, for the forming of friendships. There were highlights that emerge from the shadows: people and incidents that were a source of enjoyment and companionship. Amongst these, I remember the teachers who cared; who stimulated; who opened new avenues of thought; who discussed important relevant issues. And I sincerely appreciate and thank them. There were, indeed, things learned and benefits gained.

However I cannot forget all that was futile, and I dream of all that could have been that wasn't. There were not enough opportunities for individual development, creativity, or thought. Boredom, routine, and narrowness caused the challenges to

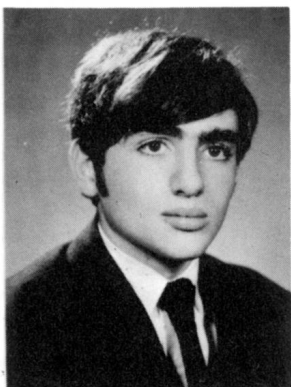
be too few. I know many intelligent people who have found school uninspiring - they feel that they were not educated relevantly for the realities of the world we live in, and they consider their education, experience, and personal development to have been largely a result of influences and factors outside this system.

The school system must provide a more fulfilling, enriching education. It must abandon its guidelines rooted in the past. As it seeks paths of renewal, it must recognize that change can come only from within. School must be more personal and more informal. The student requires stimulation so that he can develop his own resources. He learns best from seminars

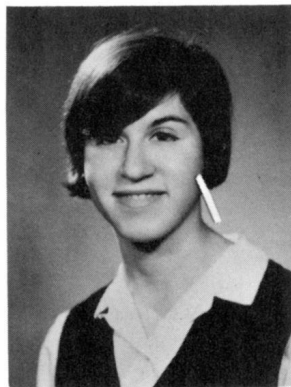
and discussions. He wants courses which have flexible frameworks, not syllabuses that are rigidly dictated. He wants a revision of stagnant curricula and limited subject matter, instead of attention to dress and personal habits. Most of all, he desires meaningful communication between himself and teacher, based on mutual respect and recognition that the world offers us all a common destiny.

We are students living in the daring unpredictable 60's and 70's. These are times of political and social revolution, of lightning advances in science and technology, and of our struggle to adjust to our sometimes familiar - but more often frightening - environment. We must learn to conquer the technology we have created, and education is our only weapon. H.G. Wells said, "there exists a race between education and catastrophe". We have learned to question and challenge; we will accept nothing less than an education that will prepare us for modern life. The present system must be transfused with new guidelines and directives so that it can become the vital force that will halt man's increasing victimization, that will return to him his optimistic spirit, that will rechannel his energies toward 'winning the race'. The school system must adapt itself to the 1970's by undergoing sweeping changes and fundamental reorientation. Only then can education win the race, and enable us to avert catastrophe.

PROPOSED PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

In an effort to promote physical fitness in our physical education program I would like to propose the following:-

1. That all the students in Years 1, 2, and 3 be required to take gym a minimum of four times a week. Years 1 and 2 students could have three 25 minute periods and one 50 minute period a week without seriously reducing the total time spent in history classes and, therefore, enabling us to incorporate skills with a comprehensive physical fitness program. Year 3 students could have four 25 minute periods a week, which would allow us to offer them a complete fitness program, but would virtually eliminate the teaching of skills. I feel that fitness should take precedence over skills and this belief is essentially the difference in this program as opposed to the more traditional methods of teaching physical education now being used throughout the Montreal area.
2. In order to offer a diversified program of progressive resistance exercises, I would like to request that the following pieces of equipment be installed in the gym:
 - a) 2 peg boards
 - b) 2 Horizontal Ladders
 - c) 8 Sit-up Boards
 - d) 1 Monkey Travel Bar
 - e) 1 Chinning Bar
3. This program provides an excellent opportunity to promote fitness in the majority of the student body. It does not seem to require any change in the data cards needed for programming the curriculum via the Board's computer. It does, however, cut down on the time available for the teaching of skills (which many children can't perform adequately since they aren't fit enough). This entire program could be set up on a one year experimental basis. Careful records of student progress could be kept and compared to those of a preceding year, or with a "control school" still teaching physical education in the traditional manner.
