Wagar's 77-78 Bands had a most exciting year. With 166 students, it was at its all time high.

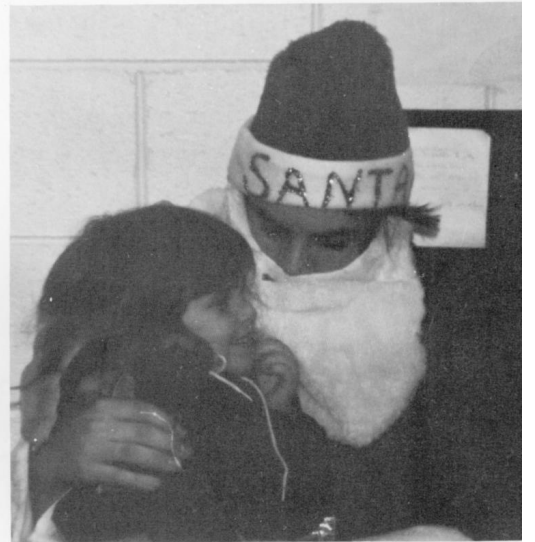

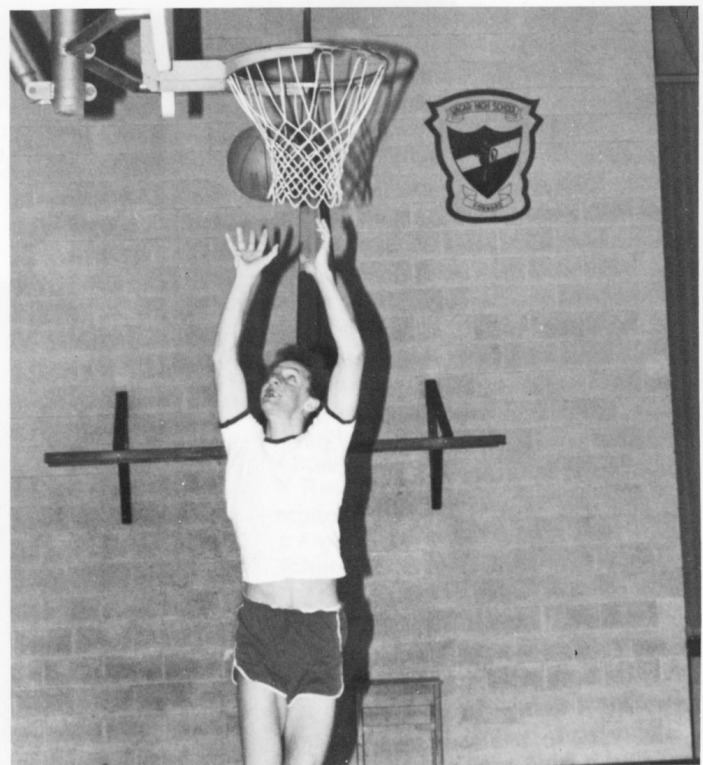
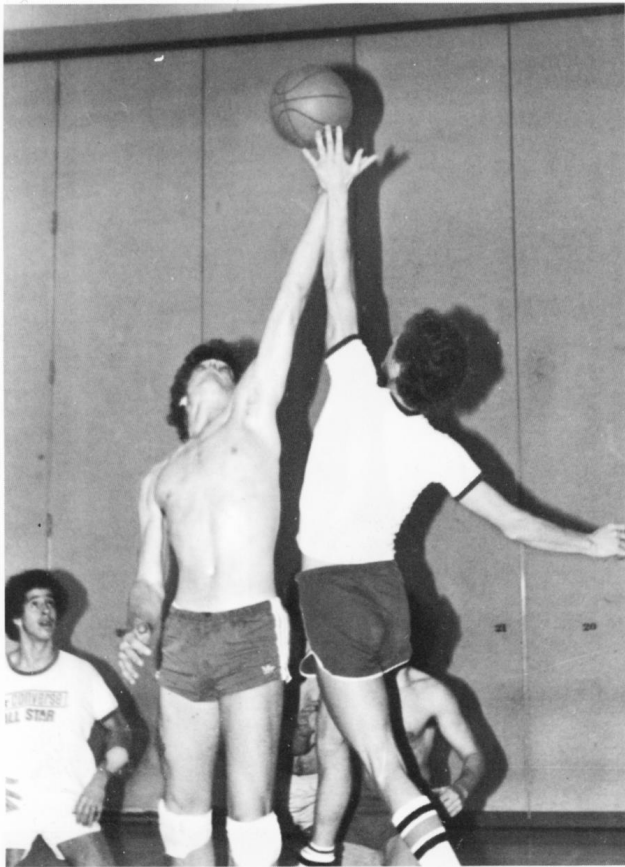

THE WAGAR LION

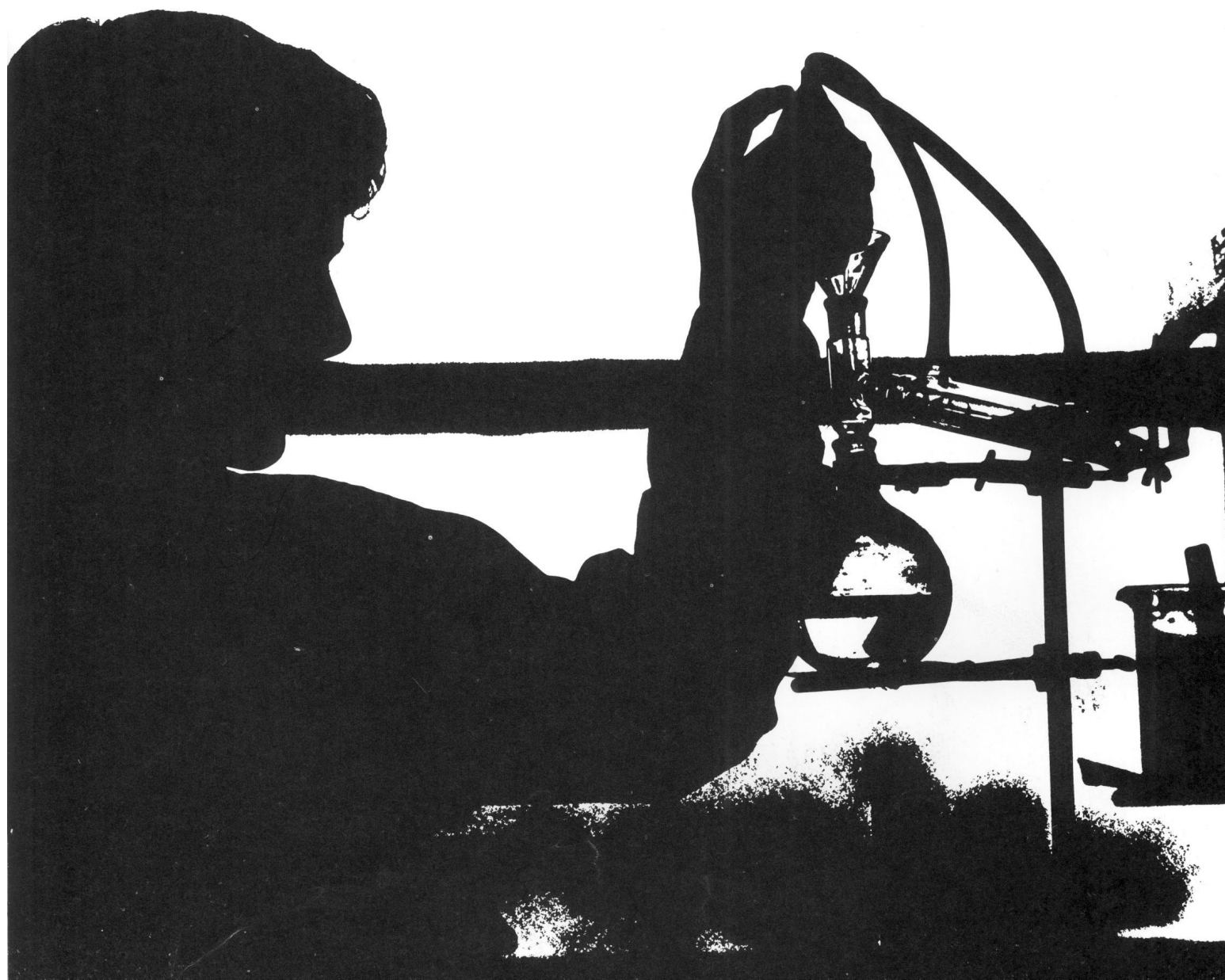
