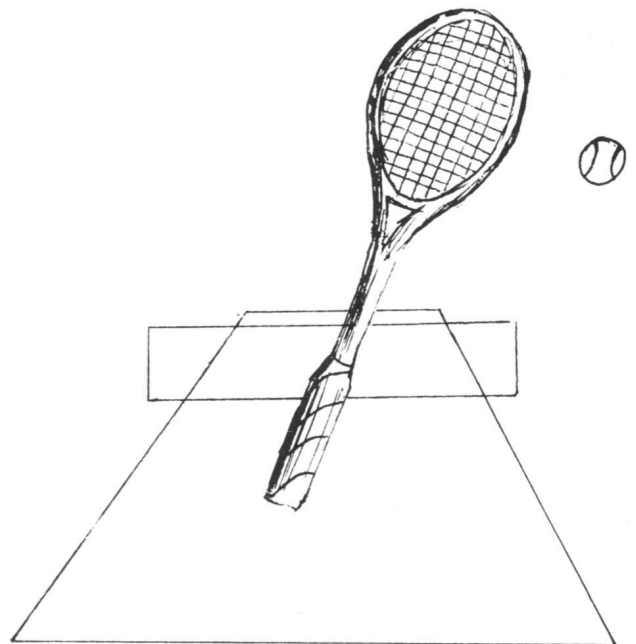
# Tennis

## Juvenile Girls' Basketball

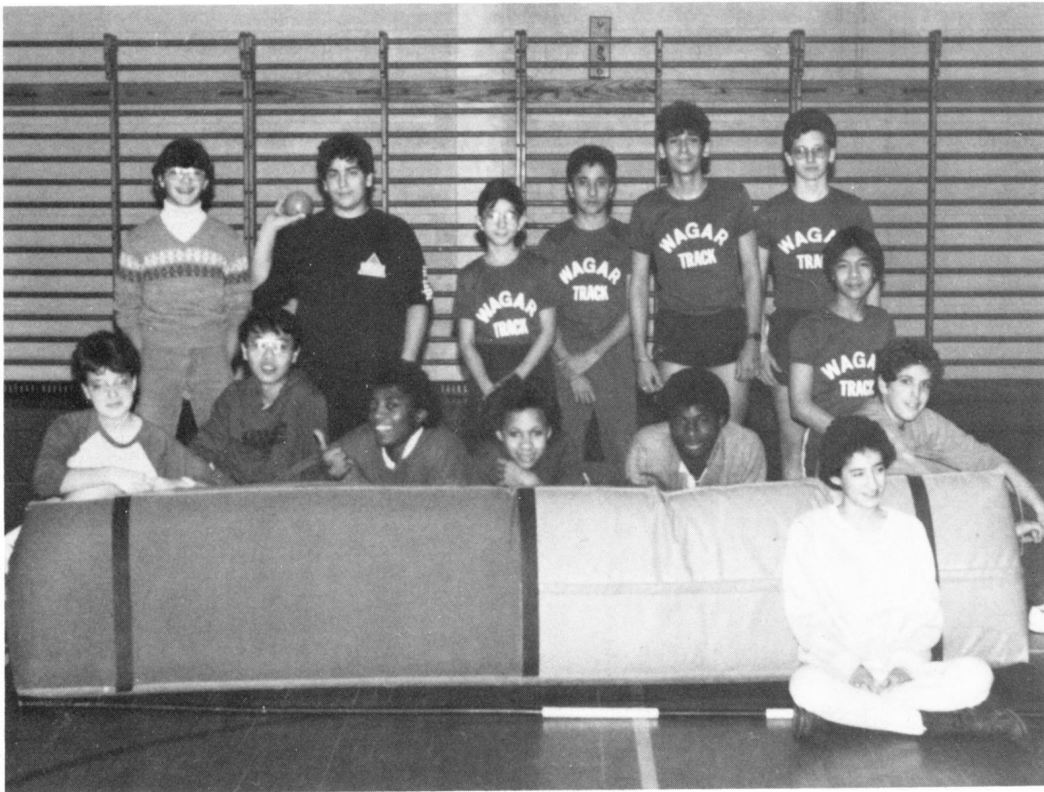
