It is indeed a pleasure to write a short message to our graduating students, to commend them for work well done and to urge them to continue in their quest for academic excellence.

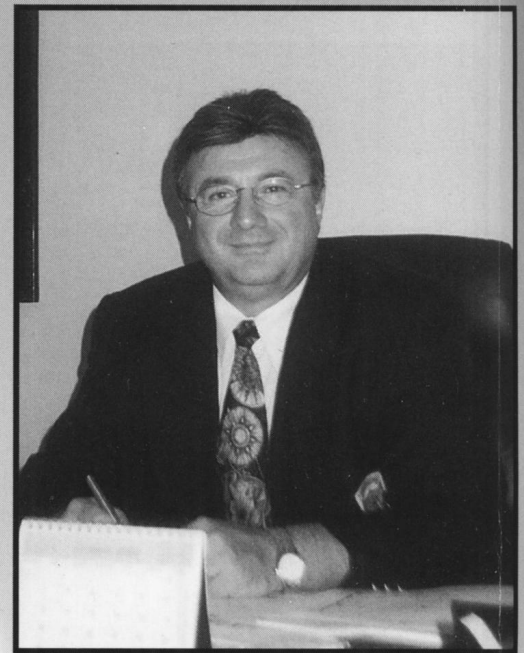
