Dear Graduates:

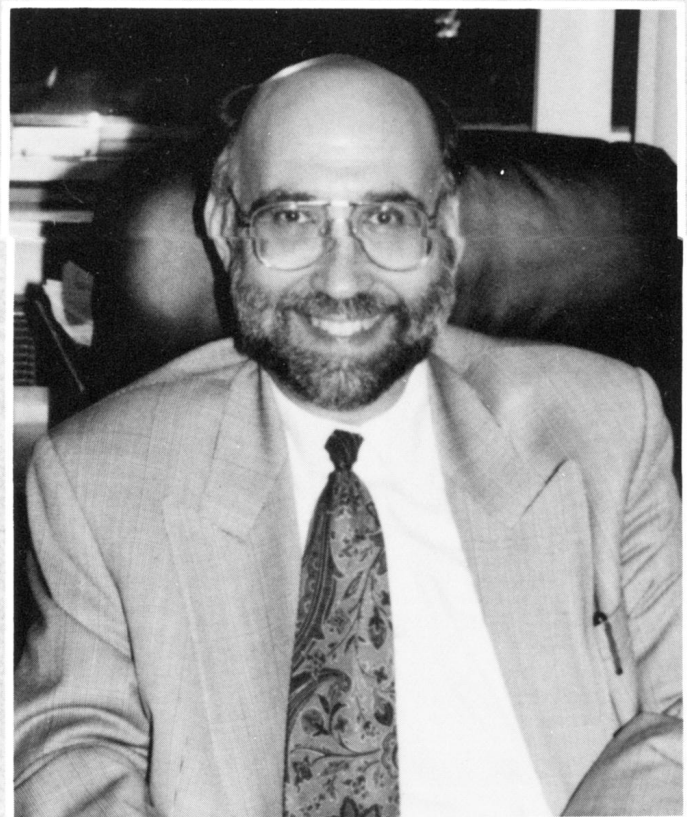

Please accept my sincere wishes for health, happiness and success in all your future endeavors.

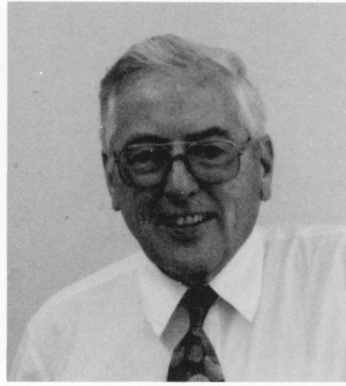
